Jennifer Kresge has undergraduate and graduate degrees in psychology and a Masters of Governance certification. A mediator for over twenty-six years, she has mediated over 2,000 cases with a variety of disputes, resulting in expert awareness of the complexities of dispute resolution.

Ms. Kresge is a mediator and trainer of negotiation and mediation programs as well as an innovator in the integration of neuroscience into the fields of psychology, negotiation, and conflict resolution. She provides training in mediation and neuroscience nationally and internationally. She has been an adjunct professor in both the private and public sector, including Loma Linda University, California's Administrative Office of the Courts, Southern Methodist University, and Pepperdine School of Law. Past President of the California County Boards of Education, in addition to

initiating the development of a Strategic Plan for the Boards of Education, she was one of three state county board members selected to serve on the legislative public policy making committee of California. Ms. Kresge is the liaison for Napa Superior Court's Peer Court and Restorative Justice Programs, President of the Association for Dispute Resolution of Northern California, an Advanced Practitioner/Trainer member of the Association for Conflict Resolution, a member of the Legislative and Public Policy Committee of ACR, and a member of the Napa Valley Leadership Council.

For the past nine years, Ms. Kresge has been involved in neuroscience research and is a member of the Brainy Bunch. She is passionate about understanding brain research and its implications for purposeful thought and creating change.
